# LASTMA Deploys Drone To Monitor, Manage Traffic

### Culled

Lagos State Transport Management Agency, LASTMA says it has deployed technology especially drones to reduce human contact in managing traffic in the state.

LASTMA's Director Logistics and Transport, Mr Jubrin Oshodi, said this at the Nigerian Institute of Transport Technology, NITT Awards and Dinner in Abuja.

"We have deployed the traffic management solution device to conduct enforcement instead of physical contacts between our operatives and violators.

"We have deployed drones to monitor and manage traffic to get real-time information as it relates to any activity, especially road traffic incidents on the road," he said.

On winning the award of Best State Traffic Management Agency, Oshodi said it had been a challenging process.

"It is a challenge for us to be able to develop on our potential, improve on our efforts and bring to bear more meaningful

and impactful results in what we do on a daily basis to ensure free flow of traffic.

"It is also challenging trying to ensure safe mobility, deploying advanced developmental paradigms within society and drive economic prosperity for the benefit of the state and Nigeria as a whole," he said.

He also stated that the agency was deploying technology in data collection to help the agency record road traffic incidents.

# LASTMA Warns Dispatch Riders After Ikeja R'way Crossing Accident

### Culled

A tragic collision between a moving train and a dispatch motorcycle at the PWD Railway Level Crossing in Ikeja has claimed the life of a dispatch rider, prompting renewed warnings from the Lagos State Traffic Management Authority (LASTMA) on the dangers of reckless driving.

According to an official statement released by LASTMA, the accident occurred earlier today when the rider of a dispatch bike identified by registration number AGL 179 QR attempted to speed across the railway track in a bid to access the Government Reserved Area (GRA) of Ikeja.

Eyewitness accounts and preliminary investigations by on-site security personnel suggest that the rider, travelling at high speed, tried to outpace an approaching train but was fatally struck in the process.

The victim reportedly died instantly, while the train continued its journey down the line.

LASTMA officials were first to respond, immediately securing the scene to prevent further incidents and maintain traffic flow in the area.

They were supported by officers from the Shogunle Police Division, while the Lagos State Environmental Health Monitoring Unit (SEHMU) later arrived to evacuate the body of the deceased.

In a statement, LASTMA General Manager, Mr. Olalekan Bakare-Oki, expressed condolences to the victim's family and called the incident a sobering reminder of the consequences of impatience on the road.

"This is a distressing reminder of the dire consequences of impatience and disregard for traffic safety rules, particularly at railway level crossings," said Bakare-Oki.

He appealed directly to dispatch riders and other road users to exercise caution, patience, and discipline especially around railway crossings.

The General Manager emphasised the need for strict adherence to traffic lights,

Umahi, has however, assured Nigerians of the road's structural integrity and adherence to approved international specifications.

While expressing satisfaction with the level of work executed by the contractor handling the project, the Minister emphasised that upon completion, the road is engineered to last for more than 50 years.

According to him this "align with the federal government's commitment to delivering durable, safe, and cost-effective road infrastructure in the

country.

While assuring that there is no cause for concern, Umahi said that the construction of the 86.43-kilometre highway is in accordance with approved engineering designs and specifications, adding that the structural integrity of the pavement was not compromised.

Umahi, was represented by the

Controller of Works in Ondo State, Olajide Hussein, monitored the Ajue corridor of the project in the Odigbo council area of the state.

He said, "We also saw the viral video, and the complainant specifically mentioned the use of wire mesh on the outer shoulders and suggested that the contractor use the same heavy reinforcement here on the carriage

where we are standing with the outer shoulders. There is a functional difference between the main carriageway and the outer shoulder.

"So, there are also structural differences in their construction. The main carriageway is the central part of the road pavement, and it is used for continuous traffic, with very heavy traffic loads running constantly.

# Lagos Estate Seeks Govt's Intervention Over Deplorable Roads

Residents of Ajao Estate in the Oshodi/Isolo Local Government Area of Lagos State have sought the intervention of the local and state governments over the worsening condition of some road networks in the community.

The residents who spoke to PUNCH Metro during a visit to the community on Monday also accused the government at the local and state levels of neglecting their relentless clamour for immediate intervention over the years.

According to them, the dilapidated roads had crippled social and economic activities in the community situated less than five minutes from the Murtala Muhammed International Airport, Ikeja.

The affected streets include Fatai Irawo, Olutosin Ajayi, Awoniyi, Joe Best, and Joy Avenue, all of which are connected to Lateef Salami Street.

Others include but are not limited to Cohbam Street, Tiamiyu Street, Stella Solanke, Ajibade Street, Seth Adedeji,

and Akinsanya Street.

An 88-year-old resident, Chief Olu Isijola, described the poor state of the roads in the community as "absolutely disgraceful."

He lamented that the roads were neglected by the government despite the closeness of the estate to the nation's prime airport.

He said, "It is absolutely disgraceful. It is a disgrace that a place so close to the international airport is completely neglected."

# Katsina Unveils Hybrid Buses To Boost Eco-friendly Transport

The Katsina State Government, on Thursday, unveiled a fleet of hybrid buses as part of Governor Dikko Radda's efforts to modernise public transportation and promote environmental sustainability across the state.

A hybrid-electric bus is powered by an electric motor and a smaller-than-normal conventional internal combustion engine.

The development comes one year after the governor led a delegation to China to seal partnerships with leading agricultural equipment manufacturers.

Speaking at the unveiling ceremony held at the facility of a Chinese firm, Woerka Nigeria Limited, in Abuja, the President of Ben 10 Equipment Company and a key partner in the project, Oshi Benard, commended the governor for his commitment to sustainable development.

He described Radda as "hard-working, industrious, focused and dedicated," adding that the project reflects his

passion for improving the lives of ordinary citizens and empowering youth in Katsina State.

"The initiative is expected to transform intra-city movement in Katsina, Daura, and Funtua, with plans for future expansion across the state.

"We want to especially thank Governor Diko for giving us this great opportunity to promote a world-class project," he said.

Benard also explained that the new hybrid buses, which run on both fuel and electricity, are designed to reduce carbon emissions, cut fuel costs, and improve mobility for residents.

In his speech, Project Manager of Zhong Tong Bus, Wei Yanbin, explained that the state government will initially procure 30 city buses for the first phase of the project.

According to him, the company will also construct three bus terminals and 60 bus stops along designated routes.

"This project will commence this October and will be delivered within six months," Yanbin said.

# Troops Dismantle 7 Illegal Refinery Sites, Foil Oil Theft Worth Over N98m

Troops deployed across the country to combat terrorism, banditry, and economic sabotage have destroyed seven illegal refinery sites and foiled oil theft valued at over ₦98 million, according to the Defence Headquarters.

Major General Markus Kangye, Director of Defence Media Operations, disclosed this on Thursday while briefing journalists on recent military operations. He said troops also rescued 30 kidnapped victims, arrested 44 suspects involved in terrorism and oil theft, and neutralized several armed elements within the past week.

Detailing the operations, Kangye said troops of Operation Delta Safe recovered 92,500 litres of stolen crude oil, 1,575 litres of Automotive Gas Oil (AGO), 660 litres of Dual-Purpose Kerosene (DPK), and 5,000 litres of Premium Motor Spirit (PMS), among other items.

He explained that the combined worth of the recovered products was estimated at ₦98,705,495.

Troops also destroyed 11 crude oil cooking ovens, seven dugout pits, nine boats, and 14 storage tanks used in illegal refining. Thirteen suspects were arrested, while various arms and ammunition were recovered.

Between October 9 and 12, 2025, the troops conducted operations in Ethiopie East, Ughelli South, Ndokwa, Okpe, and Warri LGAs of Delta State, as well as Ahoda East and Toru LGAs of Rivers

State, resulting in the arrest of nine additional suspects.

In the South East, troops of Operation Udoka arrested a suspected commander of the proscribed IPOB/ESN group identified as "Gentle," along with eight other suspects in Owerri West and Mbaitoli LGAs of Imo State and in parts of Ebonyi State.

Recovered items included weapons, ammunition, and a vehicle.

Kangye also confirmed that a female logistics supplier to the group was arrested in Umunneochi LGA of Abia State. Three children found in her custody were identified as relatives of a wanted group leader, Maduabuchi Nwankwo, also known as "Emergency."

# Kwara Gov Flags Off 15.1km Ojoku-Ilemona Road

Governor Abdulrahman Abdulrazaq of Kwara state on Thursday flagged off construction of 15.150kilometre Ojoku-Ilemona road in the Oyun local government area of the state, saying the project builds on his efforts to open up communities for economic growth and pleasurable travel experience in the state. Speaking at the event, Governor Abdulrazaq said that his administration has delivered more than 100kms of road in Kwara South district alone — aside from other projects in health, education, water, and social protection sectors.

He also said that his administration is either constructing or about to award road projects spanning some 109kms in the region, including RAAMP projects.

The governor requested residents to continue to support the administration and take ownership of public infrastructure so they could last longer.

The flag-off coincided with the inspection of the Eiyenkorin-Afon-Ojoku-Offa by the governor, Minister of Works, David Umahi,

and a delegation of the BUA Conglomerate led by its Group Executive Director, Alhaji Kabir Rabi — the contractor of the 42.6km road that links Kwara Central to South and Osun state within 30 minutes.

The governor and the Works minister commended the quality of the road, with the latter saying the road should last between 50 and 100 years.

Governor Abdulrazaq reminded the Minister of the dualisation of the Ilorin-Lokoja Road, saying the project is dear to the people of the state.

# Keyamo Seeks Aviation Safety, Security Via Collaboration

Mr Festus Keyamo, the Minister of Aviation and Aerospace Development, has called for more collaboration between the judiciary and regulators to boost safety in the aviation sector.

Keyamo made the call on Thursday at the Nigeria Civil Aviation Authority (NCAA) Conference in Abuja.

The theme of the event is titled "The Role of Judges in Sustaining Nigeria's Adherence to Applicable International Conventions in Relation to Carriage by Air."

The minister said such a partnership would ensure consistency in the aviation sector in terms of safety and security.

"As we continue to implement reforms in the aviation sector, our efforts are strengthened when the judiciary and the regulators collaborate effectively to uphold shared goals.

"Aviation disputes are often technical and demand not only knowledge of the law but also an appreciation of international standards, insurance mechanisms, and operational realities.

"That is why the NCAA's initiative to convene this roundtable is commendable. It bridges the communication gap between the regulators and those who are tasked with interpreting those regulations."

According to him, the ministry's goal is to establish a system that commands trust from passengers, investors, and international partners, built on safety, accountability, and justice.

Keyamo described the gathering as a meeting of minds at the crossroads of law, policy, and international civil aviation; an intersection that defined how to protect lives, resolve disputes,

and maintain confidence in a nation's skies.

"Aviation, by its nature, is an international enterprise. Aircraft cross borders daily; obligations and liabilities often follow them as provided for in several civil aviation treaties to which Nigeria is a signatory.

"This means that our judges, more than most professionals, bear the task of interpreting treaties and conventions in ways that reflect both our national interest and our international obligations.

"My lords, you are therefore partners in shaping Nigeria's reputation in the global civil aviation community," he said.

Keyamo said when the court interpreted a provision of international conventions, it resolved a dispute and sent a signal to the world about how Nigeria honoured its commitments under international law.

Earlier, the NCAA Director-General, Capt. Chris Najomo said that Nigeria's continuous adherence to the international conventions was a

statement of national integrity and institutional strength.

According to him, when the law is interpreted with clarity and purpose, it becomes the foundation upon which safety, fairness, and trust are built in aviation.

"Nigeria's obligations under key instruments such as the Convention on International Civil Aviation of 1944 and the Montreal Convention of 1999 reflect our nation's dedication to international best practices.

"Yet, conventions achieve their true force only when upheld in our courts, and this is where the critical role of the judiciary comes in.

"Through their judgments, our judges interpret not just the letter of the law, but its spirit and intent, thereby balancing the interests of passengers, operators, regulators and the State," he said.

According to him, the NCAA remains committed to continuous alignment with international standards, robust oversight, and transparent governance.

The Dangote Petroleum Refinery has intensified efforts through the use of Compressed Natural Gas (CNG)-powered trucks to distribute Premium Motor Spirit, PMS, also known as petrol at N850 per litre to different parts of the nation.

Checks by Vanguard yesterday indicated that the deployment of the CNG trucks has enabled the 650,000 barrels per day refinery to sustain supplies as NNPC Limited increased its depot price to N900 per litre from N850 per litre.

Chief Executive officer of Petroleumprice.ng, Olatide Jeremiah, said: "Generally, the depot prices have increased. Market data showed that petrol sold between N870 and N900 per litre at key depots in Lagos and Calabar, reflecting a steady climb over the past week.

"In Lagos, where most private depots rely on imported supply, prices remained elevated even after recent reviews. Aiteo and Pinnacle both sold petrol at N890 and N

870 per litre, while Sobaz Depot hit N900 per litre —the highest impact the domestic Integrated Oil and Gas recorded so far this market." However, the retail prices of petrol have increased

"At Calabar, Matrix would likely crash once by 6.8 percent to N955 Energy and Northwest the Dangote Petroleum per litre, from N890 per litre sold last week. Refinery completes its litre sold last week. The NNPC, and stations

owned by Independent Marketers in Lagos and Abuja showed that the petrol was dispersed between N900 and N955 per litre.

Also, petrol marketers across Abuja, the nation's capital, on Tuesday increased their pump price by over N50 per litre following a similar increase by NNPC Limited.

Checks around the city showed that Adova Plc raised their price from N899 it sold last week to N945 per litre. AYM Sharfa also hiked its pump price from N910 per litre to N955 per litre.

Retail outlets managed by independent marketers also raised their prices by as much as N70 per litre, RYBN Station along Nyanya-Karshi Road dispensing at N997 per litre from N920 it sold last week.

Speaking to Vanguard at AYM Station in Karu, a motorist, John Ogaba complained that the price was getting out of control after hopes that the direct supply by Dangote Refinery would further reduce the price.

"The stations were selling below N900 per litre when Dangote announced that it will supply stations directly using CNG powered trucks to reduce the cost of logistics.

## Niger Delta Forum Praises Tinubu, NUPRC For Oil Community Reforms

A coalition of civil society organisations under the umbrella of the Niger Delta Advancement Forum (NDAF) has commended President Bola Ahmed Tinubu and the Chief Executive of the Nigerian Upstream Petroleum Regulatory Commission (NUPRC), Gbenga Komolafe, for what it described as the "most transparent and impactful community development initiative" in the history of Nigeria's oil industry.

In a statement issued on Wednesday, the group's President, Comrade Ebiwei Timipre, said the completion of 536 community projects across oil-producing states through the Host Community Development Trust (HCDDT) signalled "a turning point in the Niger Delta's

long quest for justice, inclusion, and equitable development."

Timipre praised President Tinubu's administration for demonstrating "unprecedented political will" by empowering the NUPRC to fully implement the Petroleum Industry Act (PIA), which had previously suffered years of delay.

"For decades, oil-bearing communities endured unfulfilled promises and abandoned projects," he said. "But under President Tinubu, we are witnessing a transformation. Through the visionary leadership of Engr. Komolafe, the NUPRC has ensured that the Niger Delta's oil wealth is now being channelled into schools, hospitals, roads, and livelihoods for our people."

According to the NDAF, records from the Commission show that as of October 13, 2025, contributions by oil companies to the Host Community Development Trust Fund had reached ₦373 billion. The group described the milestone as "a historic

leap in fiscal accountability" and a testament to the success of Tinubu's reform-driven governance.

The forum also lauded the Commission's HostComply digital dashboard — a transparency tool that tracks all deposits and disbursements to host community funds — which it said had brought an end to the opacity that once characterised oil-sector interventions.

Particular reference was made to projects executed in Rivers State, where the NUPRC recently facilitated the completion of ten projects and launched another ten under the Obagi HCDDT operated by TotalEnergies. The developments include hospitals, schools, and rural roads benefiting local communities.

Timipre described the achievements as "clear evidence that the President's Renewed Hope Agenda is delivering tangible results," adding that "the partnership between the Presidency and the NUPRC has

given new meaning to resource justice in the Niger Delta."

He urged oil companies to continue to comply with the PIA requirement mandating a three per cent contribution from their operating expenditure to host community development, assuring them that the current administration had restored credibility and transparency to the system.

"For once, the Niger Delta is witnessing the true dividends of oil," Timipre stated. "What past governments failed to achieve in decades is now being delivered under President Tinubu. We remain deeply grateful and confident that this transformation will endure."

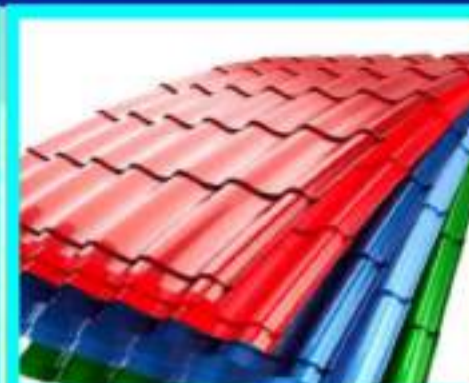

# EU Court Rules Dogs Are Same As Baggage For Airline Liability

*Culled*

The European Union's top court ruled Thursday that a dog travelling in an aeroplane's cargo hold counts as baggage, meaning airlines are not required to pay higher compensation if the animal is lost.

The ruling stems from a dispute between Spanish airline Iberia and a passenger whose dog went missing on a flight from Buenos Aires to Barcelona in October 2019.

The dog, which had to travel in the aircraft's hold due to its size and weight, escaped while being taken to the plane and was never found. The passenger sought €5,000 (\$5,400) in damages. Iberia accepted responsibility but argued that compensation should be limited to the lower amount set for checked baggage under the Montreal Convention,



which covers airline liability.

The Spanish court handling the claim referred the question to the European Union Court of Justice, which

sided with the airline. "Even though the ordinary meaning of the word 'baggage' refers to objects, this alone does not lead to the conclusion that pets fall

outside that concept," the Luxembourg-based court ruled.

An animal can be considered "baggage" for liability purposes "upon the condition that

full regard is paid to animal welfare requirements while they are transported," the court added.

The passenger had not made a "special

declaration of interest" at check-in, an option allowing higher compensation for an additional fee with carrier approval.

The judgment is advisory and leaves the final ruling to the Spanish court handling the compensation claim.

In view of these trade advantages, the U.S has pledged to expand its African market access through Lomé port.

Last week, the U.S Embassy in Lomé, led by the Chargé d'Affaires, Richard C. Michaels, conducted a tour of the port facility.

The delegation also held a meeting with the management of Lomé Container Terminal, LCT, to explore commercial opportunities for U.S businesses.

"With advanced deep-water capabilities, cutting-edge equipment, and an annual throughput exceeding 30 million tons, Lomé offers U.S businesses unmatched access to African markets.

"Ongoing infrastructure expansion, including a dry-port and industrial zone, further enhances the port's role as a growing gateway," commented U.S Embassy in Togo.

The port tour followed shortly after U.S President, Donald Trump, met five African

leaders in Washington.

The African leaders were largely from countries in West Africa, including Gabon, Guinea-Bissau, Liberia, Mauritania and Senegal.

The meeting with Trump concentrated on trade opportunities for both sides, at a time the U.S government is cutting aid in Africa and other regions.

Meanwhile, Russia has ratified its military cooperation agreement with Togo, which was initially signed early this year.

As per the agreement, Russia and Togo will jointly hold military exercises, training exchanges and weapons and military equipment support.

Notably, the agreement also covers support in hydrography, navigation and combating piracy.

According to some observers, the agreement will give Russia unfettered access to Togo's strategic seaport of Lomé. Visit by Russian military ships to ports in Togo is covered by the cooperation.

"Togo is considered the most organised and equipped in Tropical Africa. For example, the busiest seaport in West Africa is located on its territory," said Vladimir Gruzdev, a member of the Russian Government Commission on Legislative Activity, which drafted the ratification law of the defence. # Nigeria's Open Banking Will Happen Soon - CBN

**Culled:** The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) has clarified that open banking has not gone live yet, despite earlier expectations of an August 2025 rollout.

The regulator, however, assured that work is

progressing on the governance structure and API standardisation required for a safe and functional system.

"Open banking hasn't gone live yet," said Chai Gang, Deputy Director at the CBN's Payments Systems Policy Department during a panel

session at Moonshot by TechCabal

"We've put together a governance structure and are building a standardised API template. It will happen soon."

The CBN issued operational guidelines for open banking in March 2023, but technical and regulatory groundwork is still being finalised before the full rollout.

The bank did not provide a new launch date.

"There are the guidelines for open banking in Nigeria and the framework for open banking in Nigeria," Gang explained. "We must be careful who has access to customers' personal data."

Open banking allows licensed financial institutions and third-party providers to share customer-

approved data through APIs.

Once live, it is expected to unlock new digital financial products and expand access to credit across multiple sectors.

"One of the strongest foundations for open banking is customer consent," Gang added. "We are building an automated process to ensure customers know what data is used, for how long, and can revoke permission anytime."

Gang explained that when Nigeria's open banking ecosystem finally launches, there will be clear accountability for data breaches. "Liability lies with whoever loses the data," he said. "Data at rest or in flight must be protected, and whoever fails to do so bears responsibility."

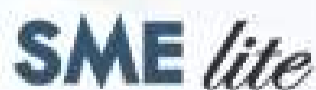

# Nigeria Assures Foreign Investors Of Conducive Business Environment

*Culled:*

The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) has assured foreign investors that the government will continue to advance reforms and unlock opportunities for sustainable investment and growth.

CBN Governor Yemi Cardoso gave the assurance on Wednesday in Washington while addressing investors at the Nigeria Investors Forum held on the sidelines of IMF/World Bank annual meetings.

He said that the nation's external reserves had risen to 43.4 billion dollar, the highest level in five years. Cardoso assured the investors that the government would continue to

advance reforms and unlock opportunities for sustainable investment and growth.

"The CBN and the Ministry of Finance have been working hand in hand to ensure alignment, stability and clarity for investors.

"Nigeria's focus remains clear, strengthening our fundamentals, advancing reforms and unlocking opportunities for sustainable investment and growth.

"We are encouraged by the progress made so far and remain confident that ongoing reforms are laying a stronger foundation for a more resilient economy," he said.

CBN Deputy Governor on Economic Policy, Mohammed Abdullahi, said that the series of reforms introduced by the government had led to significant improvement in foreign exchange inflows.

Abdullahi said that monthly turnover in the forex market had risen by 56.4 per cent to 8.6 billion dollars in 2025, up from 5.5 billion dollars in 2024.

"Over the last two years, we have really focused a lot on improving FX inflow into the economy, and we have seen a significant jump.

"Average net flows between January 2023 and July have doubled.

"FX supply at the official window has

significantly improved and has been driven by order-based quotation, a lot of reforms around remittances and all the other issues mentioned," he said.

These, he said, include the clearance of backlogs and outstanding obligations

"Capital flows, which, during the 2019 to 2020 period collapsed by over 75 per cent have significantly improved and have therefore strengthened our external position.

"We now have deeper and more functional financial markets, much more robust and transparent," Abdullahi said.

# Nigeria Records Major Security Gains In September - Onilu

The Director-General of the National Orientation Agency (NOA), Mallam Lanre Issa-Onilu, has announced that Nigeria's security agencies recorded significant progress in the fight against insecurity in September 2025.

Speaking at the Monthly Joint Security Press Briefing for October 2025 in Abuja, Issa-Onilu said security agencies demonstrated improved coordination and

proactiveness, shifting from reactive responses to preventive operations.

The briefing, organized by the NOA in collaboration with security and regulatory agencies, aims to provide a cohesive, data-driven account of Nigeria's security efforts.

Issa-Onilu highlighted that the Nigerian Army conducted 196 operations nationwide in September, neutralizing terrorists, rescuing kidnapped victims, and dismantling

illegal arms networks.

"This month, intelligence services moved more decisively from response to prevention," he said. "By intercepting arms couriers across Niger, Plateau, Kaduna, Ekiti, Ebonyi, and Katsina before weapons could reach terror cells, the intelligence community demonstrated maturity in proactive surveillance. Smugglers using hidden compartments and disguised consignments were

apprehended through real-time tracking, community intelligence tips, and sophisticated profiling."

He further disclosed that 76 hostages were rescued in Katsina, while 30 terrorists surrendered with their families in Borno State, adding that the Armed Forces effectively combined precision operations with humanitarian safeguarding through better logistics and local collaboration.

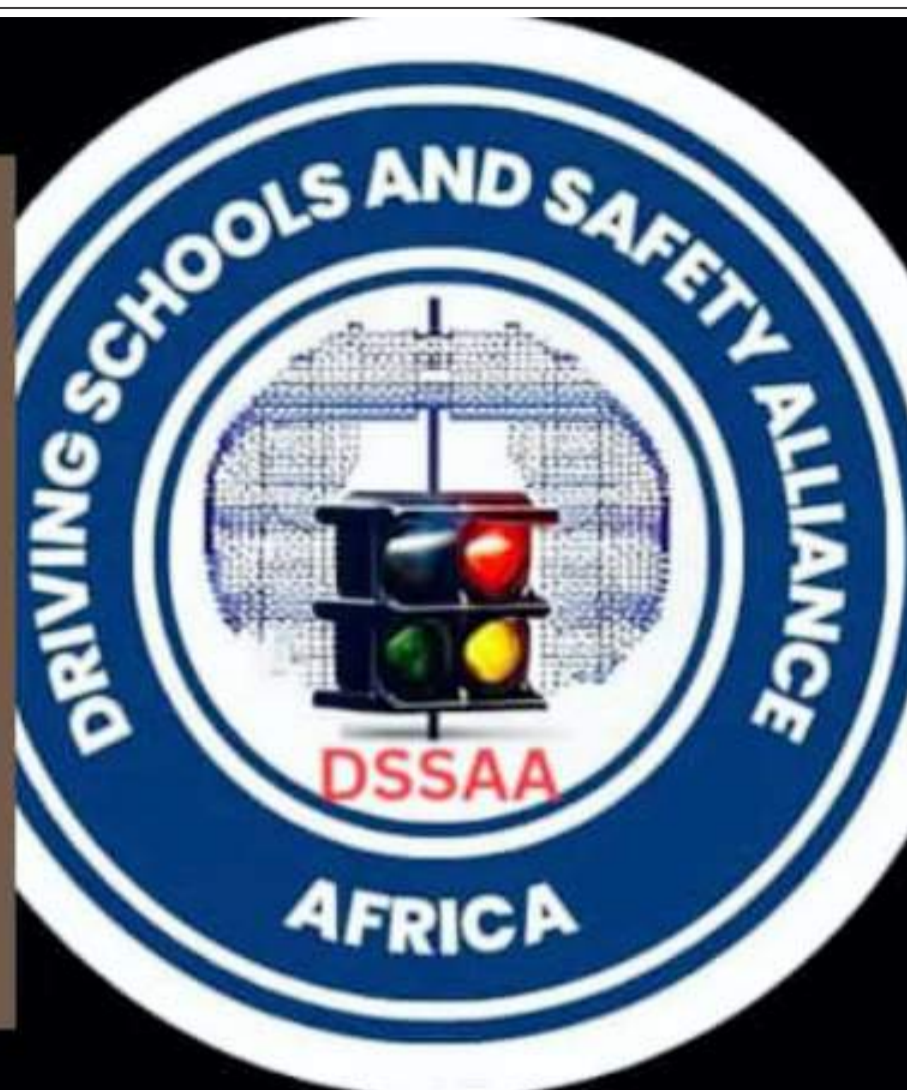
