FG Flags Off Airport Chapel, Pilgrims Centre In Abuja

The Federal Government has commenced construction of an ecumenical airport chapel and pilgrims centre at the Nnamdi Azikiwe International Airport, in a move aimed at integrating spiritual support into Nigeria's aviation infrastructure.

Secretary to the Government of the Federation, George Akume, performed the ground-breaking ceremony in Abuja on Saturday, describing the project as a landmark initiative at the intersection of faith, national development and human well-being.

According to a statement issued by the Head of Information and Public Relations in the Office of the SGF, Chris Ugwuegbulam, Akume said the facility would serve as a sanctuary for travellers, pilgrims and the Christian faithful.

He noted that the project represents a deliberate effort to incorporate spaces for spiritual reflection within critical national infrastructure.

“The facility will provide a sacred space

for individuals to pause, reflect and reconnect with God amidst the demands and uncertainties of travel,” he said.

The SGF stressed the timeliness of the initiative, pointing out that in an era of increasing mobility and pressure, the need for spiritual support systems has become more compelling.

He described the centre as a consecrated haven open to all, designed to uplift hearts, ease burdens and strengthen faith, regardless of the pressures associated with modern travel.

Lagos Waterways Passenger Traffic Hits 2 Million Monthly

Passenger traffic on waterways in Lagos has climbed to about two million monthly, as the state government ramps up efforts to position water transport as a major component of its mobility and economic strategy.

The Special Adviser to the Governor on Marine and Blue Economy, Oluwadamilola Emmanuel, disclosed this while hosting members of the Shipping Correspondents Association of Nigeria (SCAN). He said the steady rise in ridership—now estimated between 1.5 million and two million passengers monthly—reflects increasing public confidence in water transportation.

Emmanuel, who also serves as General Manager of the Lagos State Waterways Authority, attributed the growth to improved safety measures, infrastructure development, and continuous engagement with stakeholders.

He noted that the state government has commenced the implementation of a five-year development plan aimed at

transforming water transport. The plan includes the introduction of electric ferries, dredging of approximately 140 kilometres of inland waterways, and the construction of modern ferry terminals.

According to him, the initiative is designed to decongest roads while unlocking economic opportunities within the state's blue economy.

Emmanuel further disclosed that Lagos is aligning with the Federal Government's clean energy transition by exploring the use of electric ferries and the conversion of marine engines to Compressed Natural Gas (CNG).

To enhance connectivity, he said transport interchanges are being developed in strategic locations such as Mile 2 and Marina to integrate water, rail, and bus services for seamless commuting.

On safety, Emmanuel stated that incidents on the waterways have reduced significantly due to improved enforcement, infrastructure upgrades, and stakeholder collaboration.

Oyedele, Keyamo Move To Cut Aviation Fuel Costs, Support Airlines

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The Minister of Finance and Coordinating Minister of the Economy, Taiwo Oyedele, has confirmed that he recently held talks with the Minister of Aviation and Aerospace Development, Festus Keyamo, to devise measures to address the rising cost of aviation fuel and the growing pressure on airline operators, as part of broader efforts to stabilise the aviation sector and protect passengers from higher fares.

Meanwhile, Air Peace has reduced its Abuja-London flight frequency to three times per week amid Jet A1 (aviation fuel) supply constraints.

In a post on X, Oyedele said both ministers had “constructive discussions on the challenges facing the aviation sector, particularly the recent sharp rise in the cost of aviation fuel and its impact on airlines' operations and pricing.”

He added that the meeting also focused on opportunities to reposition the sector for growth, noting that government efforts are aimed at building “a more sustainable, efficient, and competitive aviation industry that

supports economic activity and connectivity.”

The discussions followed fresh government intervention earlier in the week to ease mounting pressure on domestic airlines.

Authorities approved a 30 per cent discount on outstanding debts owed by local carriers to aviation agencies, a move expected to provide immediate financial relief.

Announcing the development after a high-level meeting in Abuja, Keyamo said the decision was approved by President Bola Tinubu.

The meeting brought together oil marketers, airline operators, regulators, and other stakeholders amid concerns that rising Jet A1 fuel prices could disrupt flight operations.

Domestic airlines had warned of possible service cuts or fare increases if

the situation persisted, raising fears of reduced connectivity and higher travel costs for Nigerians.

Beyond the aviation sector, Oyedele also outlined his broader economic agenda as he settled into his role.

He said the government's immediate focus was to build on ongoing reforms and ensure they deliver real benefits to citizens.

According to him, priority areas include boosting productivity and economic growth by creating a stable and investor-friendly environment, maintaining fiscal discipline through careful management of public funds, and improving revenue generation while ensuring fair taxation that does not overburden vulnerable groups.

He also stressed the need for stronger coordination across government institutions and deeper collaboration with the private sector to improve policy design and implementation.

“Good policy design alone is not enough; success will be defined by execution.

Police Launch Welfare Bus Scheme For FCT Personnel

The Federal Capital Territory Police Command has announced the commencement of a welfare bus scheme for officers and men, aimed at addressing transportation challenges and improving personnel welfare.

The Commissioner of Police, FCT Command, Ahmed Sanusi, disclosed that the initiative was approved by the Inspector-General of Police, Olatunji Rilwan Disu, and will begin operations on Monday, April 27, 2026.

In a statement on Sunday, the command's spokesperson, Josephine Adeh, said under the scheme, three Compressed Natural Gas-powered buses have been deployed to operate along designated routes within the Federal Capital Territory and its environs. According to her, the first bus will operate from the Goshen, Auta-Balefi axis through Masaka, Mararaba, and Nyanya, terminating at Area 11 Force Headquarters, Abuja.

The statement partly read, "Under the

scheme, three Compressed Natural Gas-powered buses have been deployed to ply designated routes across the Federal Capital Territory and its environs. The first bus, with registration number NPF 7993 D, will operate from the Goshen, Auta-Balefi axis, passing through Masaka, Mararaba, and Nyanya, and terminating at Area 11 Force Headquarters, Abuja.

The Nigeria Revenue Service has described as false and misleading a viral infographic claiming that a new vehicle tax has been imposed by the Federal Government, effective July 1.

The NRS made this known in a statement by Mr Dare Adekambi, Special Adviser to the NRS Chairman, Dr Zach Adedeji, and spokesperson for the service.

According to Adekambi, the infographic directs owners of private, commercial, and corporate vehicles to pay an unspecified vehicle tax rate online or at approved banks and agencies.

He said the material, which bore no identifiable author, further asked members of the public to visit <http://www.firs.gov.ng> for more information, whereas the correct official website of the NRS is <http://www.nrs.gov.ng>.

Adekambi said the Federal Government had not introduced any fresh tax on vehicles as claimed in the material.

He advised members of the public to trust and rely only on information

disseminated through verified official channels of government or any of its agencies, and not on anonymous graphics circulating online.

"The NRS wishes to state categorically that the information did not emanate from the service or any government agency.

"Citizens are, therefore, advised to disregard the fabricated messages designed to mislead the public and instead rely on official government channels for information on government policies," he said.

He said the verdict on the infographic is that it is false, and advised Nigerians to follow the official handles of the NRS on all social media platforms and its website for accurate information about tax and its activities.

Nigerian Navy Deploys 10 Ships, Helicopters For 2026 Sea Inspection

The Nigerian Navy on Saturday has flagged off Exercise Obangame Express 2026 with the deployment of 10 ships and two helicopters, as part of efforts to strengthen maritime security in the Gulf of Guinea.

The five-day event which begun yesterday, is expected to end on Thursday, April 30, 2026.

The Sea inspection exercise will also deploy maritime domain awareness assets and elements of the Special Boat Service to engage in a series of carefully designed scenarios, including anti-illegal trafficking of arms and drugs exercise, anti Crude Oil theft operations, anti-Illegal unregulated and unreported fishing, visit, board, search and

seizure procedures, as well as search and rescue exercise and simulation of hot pursuit.

The flag off exercise took place onboard NNS Kada at the Onne Jetty in Rivers State, and drew participation from officers from sister security agencies and international partners.

Speaking at the event, the Chief of the Naval Staff(CNS), Vice Admiral Idi Abbas noted that the annual multinational exercise is critical in tackling evolving maritime threats.

Represented at the occasion by an official from Naval headquarter Abuja, Rear Admiral Patrick Effah Effah, the CNS said the exercise was also meant to build capacity personnel to counter maritime crimes, particularly, bpiracy, sea robbery, illegal trafficking and other illicit activities at sea.

He stressed that no single nation can secure its waters in isolation, describing Obangame Express as a platform for participating countries to train together, build trust and enhance

real-time operational coordination.

"This annual exercise has, over the years, evolved into a strategic platform for advancing coordinated maritime security operations within the Gulf of Guinea. It remains a critical instrument for fostering unity of effort, enhancing interoperability, and consolidating our shared resolve to secure our maritime domain against emerging and evolving threats.

"The core objectives include, to strengthen regional maritime security cooperation, enhance information sharing and maritime domain awareness, improve tactical and operational readiness, as well as to build the capacity of participating navies to effectively counter both national and transnational maritime crimes, particularly piracy, sea robbery, illegal trafficking and other illicit activities at sea..."

Furthermore, Abbas noted improved safety within Nigeria's waters, adding that, it has increased investors' confidence, encouraged shipping activities and supported the Federal

Government's drive towards a sustainable blue economy.

"I am pleased to note that the sustained collaborative efforts of the Nigerian Navy, in synergy with regional and international partners, have yielded measurable results, among others.

He thanked President Ahmed Tinubu for the commitment and supports to the military, while commending officers and personnel involved in the exercise for their professionalism and dedication.

Earlier, the Flag Officer Commanding Eastern Naval Command, Rear Admiral Chiedozie Okehie had described Obangame Express as a major annual multinational maritime exercise sponsored by the United States Africa Command.

He said the exercise has over the years evolved into a vital platform for enhancing interoperability, information sharing and tactical proficiency required to combat maritime threats across West and Central Africa.

Nigeria To Expand Deep Blue Project, Boost Maritime Security

Nigeria is set to deepen its maritime security architecture, with plans to expand the Integrated National Security and Waterways Protection Infrastructure, widely known as the Deep Blue Project, as well as ramp up local fish production to curb imports.

The Minister of Marine and Blue Economy, Dr. Adegboyega Oyetola stated this while receiving the leadership of the Nigerian Economic Summit Group (NESG), in Abuja, Nigeria's capital.

Dr. Oyetola said a proposal had been submitted to the Federal Government to upgrade the Deep Blue Project in order to further strengthen Nigeria's maritime security architecture.

He described the initiative as a game-changer, noting that Nigeria has recorded zero piracy incidents in its waters for more than four years due to the implementation of the globally-acclaimed Deep Blue Project.

On fisheries and aquaculture, Oyetola said the ministry was prioritising the sector as a key driver of food security, job creation and export earnings.

He disclosed that efforts were underway to reactivate fishing terminals nationwide and provide support for artisanal fish farmers.

“It is no longer acceptable that Nigeria continues to spend huge foreign exchange on fish importation,” he said,noting that the government is determined to end fish imports.

In a major boost for the sector, Dr. Oyetola revealed that the United States had approved Nigeria's Turtle Excluder Device, a certification that enables Nigerian shrimp exports to access both U.S. and European markets.

NUPRC Urges Refiners To Acquire Oil Blocks

The Nigerian Upstream Petroleum Regulatory Commission has urged members of the Crude Oil Refinery Owners Association of Nigeria to consider acquiring oil blocks in upcoming licensing rounds as a long-term solution to crude supply challenges.

The Commission Chief Executive, Mrs Oritsemeyiwa Eyesan, made the call during a recent courtesy visit by CORAN members to the NUPRC headquarters in Abuja, where both parties discussed ways to strengthen domestic refining capacity and ensure sustainable crude supply.

According to details of the meeting provided by the CORAN spokesperson, Eche Idoko, on

Friday, Eyesan said, “Encouraging indigenous refiners to participate in upstream asset ownership would create more stable and commercially viable crude supply arrangements while also deepening local participation across the petroleum value chain.”

She assured the refiners that Nigeria has adequate crude resources to meet domestic refining needs and reiterated the commission's commitment to policies that promote in-country value addition.

The NUPRC boss also advised refinery operators to adopt long-term crude supply contracts with producers as a practical approach to guaranteeing feedstock availability, improving operational planning, and achieving pricing stability.

However, she noted that infrastructure gaps remain a major hurdle to seamless crude delivery, citing inadequate pipeline networks, evacuation bottlenecks, storage constraints, marine logistics, and

other supply chain challenges as areas requiring urgent investment and coordinated efforts.

Members of CORAN commended the commission's ongoing regulatory reforms and its support for domestic refining, while stressing the need for effective implementation of frameworks that ensure consistent crude supply to local refineries.

Industry stakeholders have repeatedly highlighted that improved access to crude feedstock is critical to reducing Nigeria's dependence on imported petroleum products, enhancing energy security, conserving foreign exchange, and creating jobs through the growth of local refining capacity.

Idoko said the meeting is part of ongoing engagements between regulators and private refinery operators aimed at unlocking the full potential of Nigeria's downstream petroleum sector.

She assured the refiners that Nigeria has adequate crude resources to

meet domestic refining needs and reiterated the commission's commitment to policies that promote in-country value addition.

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US Revitalises Credit Programme To Boost Agricultural Trade With Nigeria

The United States has revitalised the agro-credit program through its Department of Agriculture's Export Credit Guarantee Program, known as GSM-102, to serve as an important tool for Nigerian banks and importers to use when sourcing essential inputs.

The development was disclosed during a two-day event in Lagos on Tuesday, which aimed to increase awareness and utilisation of the GSM-102 program in Nigeria.

According to a statement made available to TVC News on Sunday, the event was hosted by the Foreign Agricultural Service of the U.S. Consulate General.

The statement revealed that the program supports U.S. efforts to strengthen U.S.-Nigeria agricultural trade, build more reliable food supply chains, and increase commercial opportunities for both countries.

The statement reads, "The United States and Nigeria continue to advance a strong and growing economic partnership, with two-way trade in goods and services reaching nearly \$15 billion in 2025, up 14 per cent from 2024. Agricultural trade has been a major contributor to this

expansion, increasing to \$764 million—an 84 per cent rise from \$415 million in 2024—and underscoring Nigeria's importance as a key partner.

"The U.S. Mission remains committed to expanding agricultural trade, strengthening commercial ties with Nigerian agribusinesses, supporting private sector growth, and deepening economic engagement."

To increase awareness and

utilisation of the GSM-102 program in Nigeria, the Foreign Agricultural Service of the U.S. Consulate General hosted a two-day event in Lagos, bringing together officials from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, U.S. International Development Finance Corporation, Nigerian-American Chamber of Commerce, representatives of U.S. agricultural exporters, Nigerian banks, and

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NIDCOM Urges Nigerians To Be Cautious

The Nigerians in Diaspora Commission (NiDCOM) has appealed to Nigerians in South Africa to adhere to the advisory issued by the consulate general, warning of escalating anti-foreigner demonstrations across the country.

Following an official circular from the Consulate General of Nigeria in Johannesburg (Ref No: CGJHB/AD/209/VOL I) dated April 22, 2026, demonstrations in East London, Cape Town, Durban, and KwaZulu-Natal have turned violent, leading to looting, property damage, and injuries.

According to a statement by the Head of Media, a Public Relations and Protocols Unit, Abdur-Rahman Balogun, on Friday, intelligence noted in the Consulate's circular, further protests are scheduled to happen in the Gauteng Province, between April 27-29, 2026, with demonstrators intending to apply pressure on the South African government over the presence of foreign nationals.

In response to the above, NiDCOM is advising all Nigerian citizens to avoid any confrontation with protesters, refrain from engaging with demonstration groups, and monitor local media outlets for real-time safety information.

Nigerian nationals are also urged to remain law-abiding always.

It was further advised that Nigerian business owners were warned to protect their businesses by closing on Freedom Day, April 27, and to consider remaining closed on April 28 and 29, as foreign-owned businesses are often targeted during unrest.

While fully endorsing the position of the Consul-General, Amb. Ninikanwa O. Okey-Uche, as the Nigerian Consulate General in Johannesburg remains fully operational and is actively coordinating with South African police authorities to ensure the protection of Nigerian nationals, the statement noted that the Minister of State, Foreign Affairs, Amb Bianca Onoh, is engaging with the Foreign Affairs Minister in South Africa.

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Nigerian refugees returning from Cameroon

FG Registers 3,613 Refugees As Asylum-Seekers Rise By 32

The number of newly arrived asylum-seekers into Nigeria rose by 322 persons, amounting to 21 per cent increase in the first quarter of 2026, Sunday PUNCH can report.

This was as the backlog of refugees awaiting formal registration dropped by 3,613 within the same period, according to the latest data from the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees.

The figures are contained in successive monthly dashboards published by UNHCR Nigeria, which tracks the total population of refugees and asylum-seekers in the

country from December 2025 through March 2026 and obtained by Sunday PUNCH.

The dashboards are produced jointly by UNHCR and the Federal Government through the National Commission for Refugees, Migrants and Internally Displaced Persons, drawing on registration records, biometric enrolment data and field assessments conducted across hosting states.

They include the population of refugees and asylum seekers hosted by Nigeria, including countries of origin, demographic profiles, geographic distribution and new

arrival trends.

As of December 31, 2025, Nigeria hosted 1,528 asylum-seekers, and individuals whose claims had been lodged but not yet determined.

By February 1, 2026, the figure rose to 1,705, and by March, it stood at 1,850, showing a net addition of 322 persons over the quarter.

However, the total refugee and asylum-seeker population in the country shrank from 142,064 in December 2025 to 138,900 by March 2026, a reduction of 3,164 persons.

The drop came largely from a clearing of the backlog of persons

awaiting registration.

The backlog which stood at 16,672 in December 2025, fell to 16,582 in February, and then dropped to 13,059 by March.

According to the report, the Anglophone crisis in Cameroon, the armed conflict between government forces and separatist groups that has displaced over 584,000 people internally, is the dominant driver of refugee flows into Nigeria.

Cameroonians accounted for 119,521 of Nigeria's total refugee and asylum-seeker population in December 2025, rising slightly to 119,641 by March 2026.

Labour Party Elects New Leadership In Anambra

The Labour Party (LP) in Anambra State has elected a new executive committee led by Peter Okoye as chairman in a move aimed at strengthening the party's structure ahead of Nigeria's 2027 general election.

Okoye emerged through affirmation at the party's state congress held in Awka, the state capital, in line with the party's constitution.

The exercise was monitored by the Independent National Electoral

Commission (INEC) and attended by delegates from all 21 local government areas of the state.

Other officials elected alongside him include Chigboo Ogudebe as vice chairman, Godwin Ibekwe as secretary, Nkemakonam Okoli as publicity secretary, Barrister Emma Uduaka as legal adviser, Ifeyinwa Ezenwa as woman leader, and Comrade Jerry Nnubia as treasurer.

In his acceptance remarks, Okoye

pledged to lead an inclusive administration focused on unity, internal consolidation, and grassroots mobilisation.

He emphasised the party's commitment to offering what he described as a credible alternative anchored on good governance, equity, and justice.

“We will work collectively to reposition the party and strengthen its presence across the state,” Okoye said, calling on members and stakeholders to support

efforts aimed at achieving electoral success in 2027.

Party stakeholders at the congress commended the peaceful conduct of the exercise and expressed confidence in the new leadership's ability to expand the party's influence.

Among them, Chief Edozie Ezeugwa highlighted the need for collaboration and strategic engagement to enhance the party's competitiveness both within Anambra and nationally.

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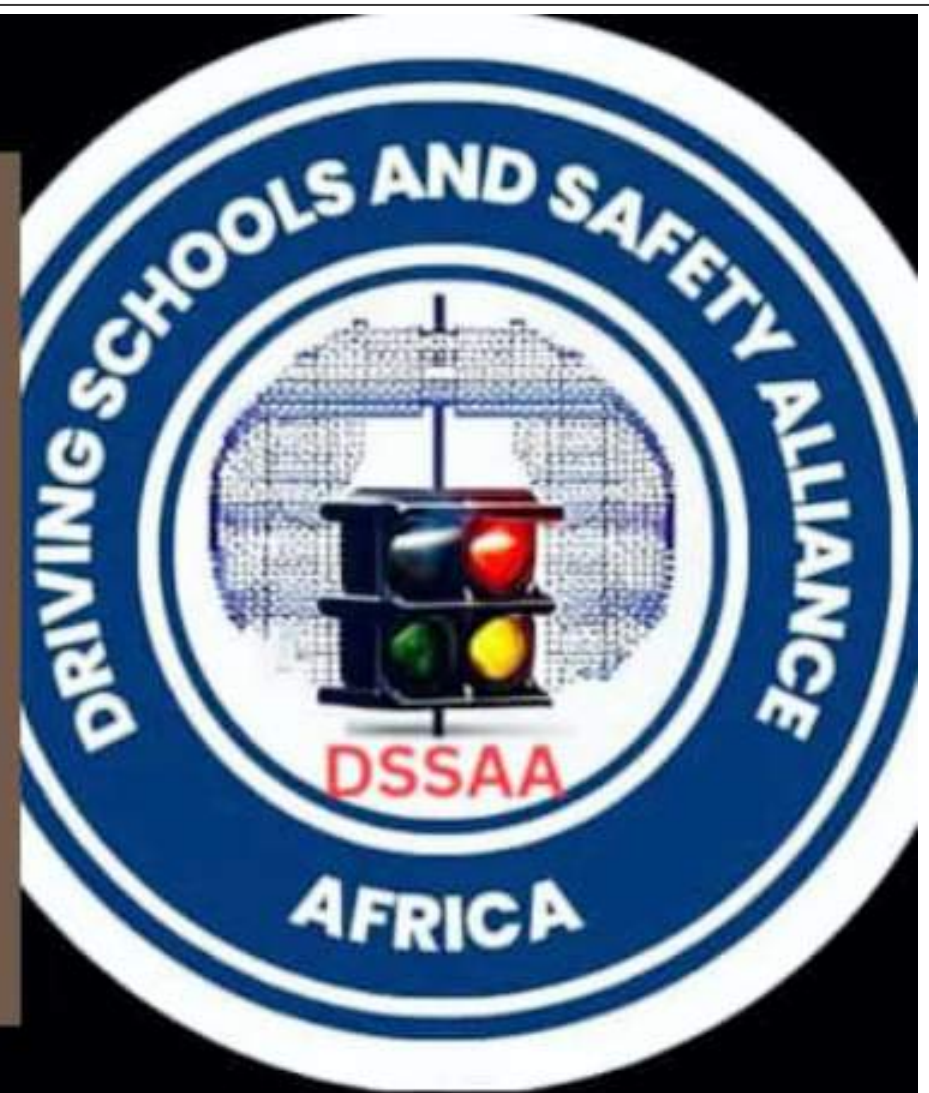
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
