FRSC Issues Travel Advisory Ahead Of Eid-el-Kabir In Lagos

The Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) has advised motorists plying the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway to be patient and comply strictly with traffic regulations amid heavy traffic volume. The Lagos State Sector Commander, Kehinde Hamzat, gave the advice in a statement on Tuesday. Mr Hamzat said the advice was necessary due to increased movements and heightened commercial activities on the expressway, particularly on the Kara–OPIC axis. “The most affected areas include Kara–OPIC and adjoining sections of the expressway, both inward and outward of Lagos. “To ease traffic flow, the FRSC advises motorists travelling through the Lagos–Sagamu–Ore–Benin corridor to consider alternative routes such as the Lekki–Epe Expressway and Ikorodu–Sagamu Road where necessary.

“Motorists on the Apapa–Badagry Expressway should remain patient, avoid dangerous overtaking and speeding, and cooperate with traffic and security personnel deployed along the corridor,” he said. Mr Hamzat said that more than 700 FRSC operatives had been deployed to traffic-prone areas across Lagos State for effective traffic control, enforcement, rescue services and public enlightenment.

FRSC Deploys 1,797 Personnel For Eid-el-Kabir Traffic Operations In Oyo

The Oyo State Command of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) has deployed 1,797 personnel, including Special Marshals, to ensure smooth traffic flow and enhance safety during the Eid-el-Kabir celebrations across the state. The Sector Commander, Corps Commander Kehinde Dahunsi, disclosed this in a statement issued on Tuesday in Ibadan through the Sector Public Enlightenment Officer, Chief Route Commander Busayo Oluwasola. According to Dahunsi, the deployment includes 24 patrol vehicles, two ambulances, and one heavy-duty tow truck to support traffic management and emergency response operations throughout the festive period. He said the command would maintain a 24-hour rescue operation aimed at responding promptly to road traffic crashes and assisting victims where necessary. The sector commander added that officers would focus on clearing traffic congestion in gridlock-prone areas while ensuring

strict enforcement against overloading of vehicles with passengers and goods. He also noted that the command had intensified public enlightenment campaigns targeted at fleet operators, commercial drivers, and passengers at motor parks to promote safe driving habits during the celebrations. Dahunsi explained that the ongoing sensitisation programmes were designed to remind motorists of the importance of obeying traffic regulations, avoiding speeding, and exercising caution on the roads. He identified the Iwo Road Interchange in Ibadan as one of the major flashpoints expected to experience heavy traffic during the holiday period, assuring residents that adequate personnel had been positioned to manage vehicular movement. The FRSC boss urged motorists to comply with traffic rules and regulations to minimise road crashes and ensure a safe Eid-el-Kabir celebration for all road users in Oyo State.

FEC Approves Nigerian Aircraft Leasing Company To Support Domestic Airlines

The Federal Executive Council (FEC) has approved the establishment of a Nigerian aircraft leasing company aimed at addressing the persistent shortage of aircraft affecting domestic airlines and reducing operational costs in the aviation sector. Minister of Aviation and Aerospace Development, Festus Keyamo, disclosed this on Tuesday in Abuja during a meeting with airline operators and industry stakeholders following the Council's approval of a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) to drive the initiative. According to the minister, the proposed leasing company will be financed through a partnership involving international investors, development finance institutions, and private sector financiers. The initiative is expected to improve access to aircraft for Nigerian airlines through more affordable leasing arrangements. Keyamo explained that Nigeria's

aviation industry is predominantly driven by private operators, unlike many African countries where airlines are state-owned or heavily subsidised. He noted that the new leasing firm would acquire aircraft and lease them to domestic carriers under naira-denominated arrangements, thereby reducing airlines' exposure to foreign exchange volatility and high

financing costs. The minister added that the structure of the initiative was designed to strengthen investor confidence through improved regulatory frameworks governing aircraft repossession and operational safety, rather than relying on direct sovereign guarantees. He further revealed that the African Development Bank has identified

Nigeria as one of the pilot countries under its continental aviation financing programme, with the bank earmarking a \$7 billion support facility for the initiative across Africa. According to Keyamo, discussions with international stakeholders are ongoing, while additional agreements are expected to be signed during upcoming aviation meetings in Brazil.

LASTMA Boss Urges Safe Driving As Muslims Celebrate Eid-el-Kabir

Gombe FRSC Deploys 613 Personnel For Eid-el-Kabir

The Gombe State Command of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) has deployed a total of 613 regular and special marshals, 14 operational vehicles, and one tow truck for the Eid-el-Adha celebration.

The deployment, approved by the Sector Commander, CC Samson Kaura, was to ensure a crash-free celebration and enhance free flow of traffic during the festive period, as contained in a statement signed by the Command Public Education Officer, SRC Janet Kassa, made available to journalists in Gombe.

She stated that the special patrol, which commenced on May 25, would last through May 31, 2026, while the deployed personnel are tasked with traffic control, rescue services, clearing of road obstructions, and reminding the public of the need to drive cautiously to avoid road traffic crashes.

According to the statement, "The Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) is the lead

agency for traffic management and administration in Nigeria. The Corps primary role is to minimize traffic crashes on the road and educate road users generally."

She added, "As the Muslim Faithful's Nationwide Observe and Celebrate Eid-El Kabir Sallah, it is the responsibility of the corps to ensure adequate and free flow of traffic nationwide."

"The State will witness an increased mass movement as a result of the 2026 Eid-El Kabir Sallah which is just around the corner. This celebration will also heightened the Command's operational activities. It is in the light of the anticipated movements that the Command made the deployment," Kassa added.

The Command has deployed operatives and logistics to monitor traffic activities and address associated gridlocks.

She stressed that, "These infractions include but not limited to speeding, dangerous driving, overloading, mix-loading, use of phone while driving, fake number plates and route violations."

Works Ministry, Police Strengthen P'ship To Secure Highways, Road Infrastructure

The Federal Ministry of Works and the Nigeria Police Force have intensified collaboration to strengthen security on major highways and protect critical road infrastructure across the country amid ongoing federal road projects.

Minister of Works, David Umahi, disclosed this during a meeting with the Inspector-General of Police, Rilwan Disu, and his delegation at the ministry's headquarters in Abuja.

Umahi said the support of security agencies had remained vital to the successful execution of strategic road projects, especially in areas affected by security challenges. He commended the police, military and other security agencies for safeguarding construction workers and infrastructure nationwide.

According to the minister, projects such as the 240-kilometre dual carriageway in Sokoto State would have been difficult to execute without adequate security support.

He revealed that the Federal Government is currently undertaking road projects valued at about N34

trillion nationwide, including inherited projects and four flagship legacy highway projects aimed at boosting economic growth and national integration.

Umahi explained that the government had adopted reinforced concrete pavement technology on many highways to improve durability and reduce maintenance costs, noting that some of the roads are expected to last

between 50 and 100 years.

He added that plans were underway to enhance security on major highways through the installation of solar-powered streetlights, closed-circuit television cameras, observation posts and dedicated police monitoring facilities.

The minister said the initiative would commence on strategic routes across the six geopolitical zones, including the

Lagos-Ibadan Expressway, Abuja-Kaduna-Kano highway, Enugu-Onitsha Expressway, Eleme-Onne corridor, Mararaba-Benue route and the Numan-Jalingo road.

Umahi also advocated strengthening the Federal Highway Patrol unit of the police to focus more on highway security, suggesting that toll revenues from major roads could help fund such operations.

He urged Nigerians to support security agencies with credible intelligence and assist the families of fallen security personnel, while also calling on political actors to embrace constructive criticism and provide practical alternatives to government policies.

The Minister of State for Works, Bello Goronyo, also commended the police leadership and called for increased support in securing construction sites nationwide.

Speaking earlier, Disu described roads as critical national assets that promote economic development, social integration and national security.

The Federal Road Safety Corps in Katsina State has confirmed the death of nine persons and injuries to 17 others in a fatal road accident involving a commercial bus and a trailer along the Kankia-Katsina Road.

Shamsudeen Babajo, the Sector Public Education Officer, confirmed this in a statement issued in Katsina, the Katsina State capital, North-west Nigeria.

He said the tragic incident occurred at Kwanar Gidan Mutum Daya at about 8:03 p.m. on Saturday.

According to him, the crash involved a Toyota Hummer commercial bus and a trailer, with a total of 26 persons affected in the accident.

Mr Babajo said personnel from the Kankia Unit Command responded swiftly after receiving a distress call, arriving at the scene within 23 minutes to commence rescue operations in collaboration with other emergency agencies.

He explained that 17 victims sustained varying degrees of injuries, including

fractures, broken limbs and severe cuts, while nine passengers died as a result of the impact of the collision.

The FRSC spokesperson further disclosed that four of the deceased victims were burnt beyond recognition after the commercial vehicle reportedly caught fire moments after the accident.

According to him, all injured victims were immediately evacuated to General Hospital Kankia for treatment, while the corpses of the deceased were deposited at the hospital mortuary.

“The rescue team worked tirelessly to evacuate victims and clear the obstruction to restore free flow of traffic along the route,” he stated.

FG Commits Over N1.3tn To S’East Road, Bridge Infrastructure

The Federal Government has announced a commitment of over N1.3 trillion for strategic road and bridge infrastructure projects across the South-East region as part of efforts to boost economic growth and regional integration.

The Minister of Finance and Coordinating Minister of the Economy, Taiwo Oyedele, disclosed this on Tuesday during the grand finale of the South-East Venture Capital Programme (SEVCP) organised by the South East Development Commission in Enugu.

Oyedele said the Federal Government was making significant investments in critical infrastructure to stimulate enterprise, attract investment and strengthen connectivity within

the region.

According to him, the projects include the Second Niger Bridge Access Road, the Enugu-Onitsha Corridor, the Enugu-Port Harcourt Expressway, the Enugu-Abakaliki Dualisation project, and the priority rail corridor linking Onitsha, Owerri, Aba and Ikot Ekpene.

He noted that the SEVCP initiative reflected the Federal Government's commitment to innovation-driven economic growth and entrepreneurship development.

Oyedele revealed that more than 1,200 applications were received from across the South-East, describing the turnout as proof of the region's strong entrepreneurial potential.

“They are designed to create a new development model — one that moves from grants to growth capital, from dependence to enterprise, and from consumption to value creation,” he said.

The minister also highlighted ongoing federal interventions aimed at improving access to finance for businesses and entrepreneurs in the region.

He stated that the Development Bank of Nigeria had deployed more than N130 billion to support about 86,000 Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) across the South-East.

According to him, CreditCorp has reached over 35,000 beneficiaries in the region, mainly women and micro-entrepreneurs, while the Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND) continues to provide interest-free education loans for students.

Oyedele further stated that Nigeria recorded a 3.89 per cent Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth in the first quarter of 2026 despite prevailing global economic uncertainties.

He attributed the growth to ongoing economic reforms, improved fiscal sustainability, infrastructure renewal and deliberate policies aimed at attracting private sector investment.

“We are building an economy that is more diversified, more productive, more competitive and better positioned to absorb external shocks,” he said.

He assured investors that Nigeria remains open for business, promising

policy consistency, investor protection, fiscal reforms and transparent governance.

Speaking at the event, the Governor of Enugu State, Peter Mbah, described the venture capital programme as a strategic intervention designed to reposition the South-East within the global innovation economy.

Represented by the Secretary to the State Government, Prof. Chidiebere Onyia, the governor said the initiative aligns with the state government's economic agenda focused on private enterprise, innovation, industrialisation and strategic investment partnerships.

Mbah added that the state government was investing heavily in infrastructure, digital connectivity, security, healthcare, education reforms and smart urban development to create a more business-friendly environment.

Earlier, the Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer of the SEDC, Mark Okoye, said the venture capital initiative forms part of the commission's broader strategy for regional economic transformation.

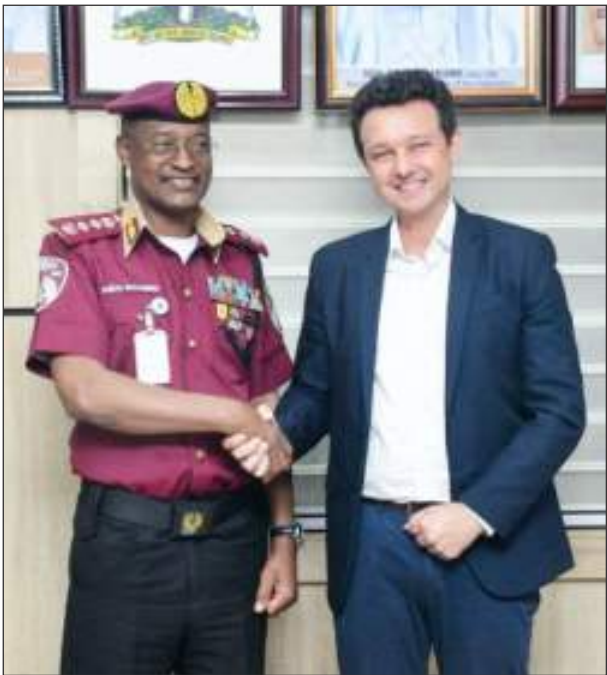

Dangote Commends FRSC As Truck Crashes Drop By 56%



Dangote Group commends FRSC on safety improvement

Dangote Cement has commended the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) for its role in improving the company's transport safety operations, following a significant reduction in crashes involving its trucks across the country. The commendation was conveyed during a visit by the Head of Transport, Dangote Group, Mr. Murillo Silva, and his team to the FRSC headquarters in Abuja. According to a statement issued on Tuesday by the FRSC spokesperson, Deputy Corps Commander Osondu Ohaeri, Silva attributed the improvement to the impact of the FRSC's 2025 Safety System Gap Analysis carried out on the company's transport operations.

Silva said the partnership between Dangote Group and the FRSC was already producing measurable results, adding that both organisations share a common goal of improving safety standards in Nigeria's transport sector. He noted that the intervention by the FRSC had repositioned Dangote's transport fleet towards becoming a model for fleet management and road safety compliance in Africa. Silva also praised the Corps Marshal of the FRSC, Shehu Mohammed, for providing strategic recommendations and professional guidance that transformed the company's transport safety system. Ohaeri explained that the earlier safety audit by the FRSC uncovered several operational deficiencies within Dangote's transport system, including violations of speed limiter regulations, inadequate driver rest management, overloading, weak safety monitoring mechanisms, and high crash exposure linked mainly to

human factors. He, however, said the implementation of the Corps' recommendations resulted in significant improvements in the company's safety record. According to comparative data presented during the review, crashes involving Dangote trucks dropped by 56 per cent, from 25 cases recorded in the first quarter of 2025 to 11 cases within the same period in 2026. The data also showed that fatal crashes declined by 36 per cent, while the number of injured persons reduced by 52 per cent, from 89 to 42. Deaths resulting from the crashes also fell by 60 per cent, from 35 in 2025 to 14 in 2026. The Corps Marshal described the outcome as proof that strategic partnerships, data-driven interventions and institutional collaboration are critical to improving road safety and saving lives. Mohammed commended Dangote management for embracing professional scrutiny and

implementing key safety reforms, noting that sustained compliance with the recommendations could position the company among the safest fleet operators in Africa. He also urged other fleet operators and transport companies to adopt proactive safety measures capable of reducing crashes and improving operational standards on Nigerian roads. Silva also praised the Corps Marshal of the FRSC, Shehu Mohammed, for providing strategic recommendations and professional guidance that transformed the company's transport safety system.
