FAAN Clarifies: No Blanket Ban On E-Hailing Services At Airports

The Federal Airports Authority of Nigeria (FAAN) has clarified that it has not imposed a blanket ban on e-hailing services at Nigerian airports.

The authority said its recent initiative was aimed at establishing an operational framework to ensure safety, security and accountability among commercial transportation operators within airport premises.

FAAN, in a statement issued by its management, explained that the initiative was not intended to restrict passengers' transportation options or undermine the operations of e-hailing platforms such as Uber and Bolt.

According to the authority, airports are highly regulated environments, requiring all commercial transportation services operating within them to function under a framework that provides adequate visibility over their vehicles, drivers and operations.

FAAN said the framework was

necessary to ensure that transportation providers operating within airport premises were identifiable, accountable and properly integrated into the airports' operational and security systems.

The authority also clarified that its ACHRAMS platform was not an e-hailing application and was not developed to compete with or replicate the services offered by Uber, Bolt or other mobility platforms.

Vehicle Dealers Challenge Lagos VIS Over Number Plate Enforcement

Vehicle dealers in Lagos have criticised the Lagos State Vehicle Inspection Service (VIS) over a viral video on the enforcement of number plate regulations, describing some of the claims made in the footage as misleading and inconsistent with existing laws governing trade licence plates.

The dealers, under their union, reacted to a recent enforcement operation by the VIS targeting alleged violations of number plate regulations by vehicle dealers across the state.

In a statement, the union said the video had created a false impression about the legal framework regulating the use of trade licence plates and sought to clarify the provisions of the law.

According to the union, the relevant regulations are contained in the Federal Republic of Nigeria Official Gazette No. 15, Volume 110, dated January 23, 2023, under the provisions of the Special Trade Licence, Part III, Section 26.

The union explained that the regulation

permits vehicle dealers to obtain trade licences for use in specific business-related circumstances. These include moving vehicles from ports, rail stations or other delivery points to dealerships, testing vehicles after assembly or repair, and allowing prospective buyers to test vehicles before purchase.

The dealers further noted that the licence also covers the transportation of new or repaired vehicles in the normal course of business, including delivery to customers. However, the union acknowledged that the regulations impose certain restrictions on the use of trade licence plates. These include prohibitions against carrying passengers or goods for commercial purposes, allowing unauthorised persons to use vehicles under dealership, and operating such vehicles between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m.

While recognising these provisions, the union argued that the restriction on vehicle movement between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. was outdated and incompatible with current business realities.

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PRNigeria Fellows Commend FRSC Reforms, Call For Stronger Road Safety Communication

The fellows made the commendation during a courtesy visit and facility tour of the FRSC headquarters in Abuja, where they engaged the Corps Marshal, Shehu Mohammed, on road safety, strategic communication and behavioural change.

Led by Samira Mohammed and Chilakpu Zoe Chinemeremebere, the delegation said the FRSC had recorded significant progress under Mohammed's leadership, particularly through policy innovation, digital transformation and improved personnel welfare.

They cited the introduction of a paperless electronic document management system, deployment of body cameras for patrol officers and

expansion of rescue services as reforms that have enhanced the agency's operations and emergency response on Nigerian highways.

The fellows also called for stronger and more sustained public communication on road safety, noting that effective communication was critical to changing risky behaviours among road users.

They further commended the FRSC for

receiving recognition in the Public Affairs category at the 2026 National Spokespersons Awards, describing the award as an acknowledgement of the agency's communication and institutional reforms.

Responding, Mohammed disclosed that nearly 5,000 Nigerians die annually in road traffic crashes, with about 80 per cent of the victims below the age of 30.

He therefore called for greater emphasis on prevention, public education and behavioural change, stressing that enforcement alone could not address the country's road safety challenges.

According to him, social and economic factors, including poverty, low literacy and limited access to affordable transportation, often influence risky behaviour among road users.

Wike Orders Demolition Of 30 Illegal Buildings On Abuja Road Corridor

The Minister of the Federal Capital Territory (FCT), Nyesom Wike, has ordered the immediate demolition of about 30 buildings allegedly constructed illegally along the Ring Road III corridor in the Karsana area of Abuja.

Wike issued the directive on Thursday while inspecting the ongoing construction of the Arterial Road N16, linking Ring Road II to Ring Road III.

The acting Executive Secretary of the Federal Capital Development Authority (FCDA), Richard Dauda, informed the minister that the affected structures had encroached on the designated corridor of the road project.

Reacting to the development, Wike directed the Department of Development Control to demolish the structures immediately, stressing that illegal developments would not be allowed to obstruct critical infrastructure or undermine the Abuja

Master Plan.

“We'll have to demolish this right now. How can it be like this? It's a road and not a layout,” the minister said.

Wike described the Arterial Road N16 project as a major infrastructure development and expressed confidence that it would be completed by December.

The minister also inspected the ongoing construction of the five-kilometre Zaudna-Kaba-Kagini Road and a Magistrate Court project in Garki.

Police Reactivate Operation Velvet To Tackle Traffic Violations In Ogun

The Ogun State Police Command has reactivated Operation VELVET across the state's 20 local government areas to intensify enforcement of traffic regulations and improve road safety.

The operation, directed by the Inspector-General of Police, Olatunji Rilwan Disu, is aimed at curbing traffic violations that endanger motorists and other road users, as well as activities that could create security risks along major highways and transit corridors.

According to a statement issued by the command on Thursday, the enforcement will focus on offences including driving against traffic, reckless and dangerous driving, unauthorised use of emergency sirens, and the use of missing, altered or concealed vehicle registration plates.

Other violations targeted under the operation include driving without a valid licence, overloading of vehicles and indiscriminate parking that obstructs the free flow of traffic.

The Commissioner of Police, Ogun State

Command, Bode Ojajuni, directed Area Commanders, Divisional Police Officers and heads of operational units to ensure effective implementation of the exercise in their respective areas.

Ojajuni also ordered that all personnel deployed for the operation be adequately briefed and closely supervised to ensure that enforcement is conducted professionally and in accordance with citizens' fundamental rights.

He warned officers against abusing the exercise, stressing that Operation VELVET must not be used as a cover for extortion, illegal detention, harassment or unauthorised impoundment of vehicles and documents.

The commissioner further stated that officers found engaging in bribery, intimidation or other forms of professional misconduct would face disciplinary action under existing police regulations.

He also warned supervisory officers that they would be held responsible for the conduct of personnel under their command.

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Tinubu Commends Fubara As Shettima Inaugurates 33.5km Rivers Dual Carriageway

President Bola Ahmed Tinubu has commended Rivers State Governor, Siminalayi Fubara, for completing the 33.5-kilometre Elele-Egbeda-Omoku dual carriageway, describing the project as a major boost to economic activities and development in the state.

Vice President Kashim Shettima gave the commendation on Thursday while inaugurating the road on behalf of the President.

Shettima said the completion of the road would create new opportunities for communities along the corridor by improving connectivity, reducing transportation costs and facilitating the movement of agricultural produce and goods to larger markets.

He also recalled the poor condition of the road in the past, noting that deep gullies, a deteriorating carriageway and security challenges had made travelling along the route difficult and discouraged motorists from using it.

According to him, the transformation of the route into a modern dual

carriageway demonstrates the importance of continuity in governance and aligns with the Tinubu administration's Renewed Hope Agenda.

Shettima described roads as “the most democratic instruments of development”, noting that their benefits extend to farmers, traders, workers, students and patients.

He urged residents of the benefiting

communities to protect the road from vandalism, reckless use and other activities capable of shortening its lifespan.

Speaking at the inauguration, Governor Fubara said the project would significantly improve security, stimulate economic activities and reconnect communities across Ikwerre, Emohua and Ogba/Egbema/Ndoni Local Government Areas.

Fubara said the corridor had previously been associated with kidnapping and oil bunkering because of its poor condition and difficult terrain.

He expressed confidence that the improved road, coupled with street lighting along its entire length, would make it more difficult for criminals to operate while enabling security agencies to respond more effectively.

“It is a corridor for kidnapping, a big corridor for bunkering, and I am convinced that with what we have done today, those things will be in the past,” the governor said.

Fubara added that the project, which includes a 99-metre bridge at the Ubimini axis, would improve movement and provide a safer environment for residents and travellers, particularly at night.

The Commissioner for Works, Prof. Temple Nwofor, said the project covered approximately 33.5 kilometres and included road construction and rehabilitation, drainage works, culverts and streetlights.

Balanga Residents Reject Claims Of Road Neglect In Gombe

Residents of Balanga Local Government Area of Gombe State have rejected claims that the area has been neglected in the implementation of the state government's 1,100-kilometre road network initiative.

A Gombe-based social commentator, Hon. Aminu Turaki, stated this on Thursday while reacting to comments attributed to Abuja-based politician, IG Wala, concerning the road projects of Governor Muhammadu Inuwa Yahaya.

Turaki urged critics of the administration to assess government projects based on verifiable facts and evidence rather than selective figures.

He said residents of Balanga were in the best position to evaluate the impact of the road projects, having directly witnessed and used the infrastructure.

"Balanga LGA cannot honestly be presented as a victim of road neglect under Danmajen Gombe," he said.

According to him, major road interventions in the area include the

Talasse–Dong–Junge–Reme–Degri, Bamba–Kutare–Mwona and Billiri–Dogon Ruwa–Bakassi–Gelengu corridors.

He said the projects had improved connectivity and facilitated the movement of farmers, traders and residents across several communities.

Turaki also faulted the use of cumulative budget allocations to assess the implementation of the 1,100-kilometre road initiative, noting that such figures could include funding for several other

Residents and motorists using the Benin-Agbor Bypass in Edo State have protested the deplorable condition of the road, calling on the government to urgently commence rehabilitation works.

The protesters, who gathered along the bypass on Thursday, expressed frustration over the muddy and congested state of the road, which they said had made movement difficult for motorists and residents.

In videos from the protest, some demonstrators appealed to the government, particularly the Federal Government, to intervene and fix the road. One of the protesters said, "APC, we no dey collect money. Make una do our road for us. Tinubu, we no need money, make una do our road for us."

The protesters also chanted, "All we are saying, give us good road," as vehicles, including heavy-duty trucks, struggled to navigate the affected sections.

A resident said the condition of the bypass had severely disrupted movement, noting that commuters were spending several hours in traffic.

"We dey live Agbor Road Bypass. No going, no coming. Everywhere close. We don spend like four hours here," the resident said.

The protest comes amid growing concerns over the condition of major roads in Edo State, with residents and road users repeatedly calling for government intervention.

Meanwhile, the Edo State Government recently announced plans to rehabilitate Okhun Road, off Upper Siluko Road, Benin City, following the failure of portions of the road.

The state government said Governor Monday Okpebholo had approved funds for the rehabilitation, while the Deputy Governor, Dennis Idahosa, confirmed that the procurement process for the

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LAAC Conference To Tackle Revenue Demands, Sustainable Aviation Growth

The League of Airport and Aviation Correspondents (LAAC) will, on September 10, convene key stakeholders in Nigeria's aviation industry to deliberate on how to balance government revenue generation with the need for sustainable growth and competitiveness in the sector.

The 30th Annual LAAC Conference, scheduled to hold in Lagos, will focus on the theme, "Towards a Sustainable Aviation Industry: Balancing Government Revenue Demands with Sector Growth."

The conference is expected to attract the Minister of Aviation and Aerospace Development, Festus Keyamo (SAN),

government officials, regulators, airline operators, airport managers, financial institutions, investors, aviation professionals, labour unions and other stakeholders across the aviation value chain.

According to the conference committee, the theme was informed by growing fiscal pressures in the aviation sector and the need to ensure that government revenue policies do not undermine the viability and competitiveness of airlines and other aviation businesses.

The committee said the forum would examine the impact of multiple charges on airlines and other operators, rising aviation fuel costs, foreign exchange challenges, aircraft acquisition and maintenance, airport infrastructure, regulatory effectiveness and the wider contribution of aviation to the Nigerian economy.

It added that stakeholders would also explore ways of expanding

government revenue from the sector without imposing excessive financial burdens that could weaken operators, discourage investment, increase airfares or limit air connectivity.

Areas expected to receive attention include increased passenger traffic, cargo development, tourism, airport commercialisation, maintenance, repair and overhaul (MRO), aircraft leasing and other emerging opportunities within the aviation value chain.

Chairman of LAAC, Suleiman Idris, described the conference as a significant milestone for the association, saying it would provide an opportunity for the aviation media to facilitate constructive dialogue on issues affecting the future of the industry.

Idris said the media had a responsibility not only to report developments in the sector but also to create platforms for policymakers and industry players to engage in meaningful discussions aimed at

addressing persistent challenges.

He stressed that sustainable growth would require a balance between government's legitimate revenue objectives and the financial capacity of aviation businesses to operate, invest and remain competitive.

"The aviation industry cannot grow sustainably if the operators are overburdened, just as government cannot abandon its legitimate responsibility to generate revenue," he said.

"What is required is a balanced and sustainable framework that allows government to earn revenue while giving aviation businesses sufficient room to grow, invest and remain competitive."

Similarly, Chairman of the conference committee, Wole Shadare, said the forum would seek to move discussions beyond identifying the challenges facing the industry to developing practical recommendations capable of supporting policy formulation and implementation.

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Lagos Police Uncover Vandals’ Tunnel Along Coastal Highway, Arrest 39 Suspects

The Lagos State Police Command has uncovered a tunnel allegedly used by suspected vandals to conceal stolen infrastructure materials along the Lagos-Calabar Coastal Highway.

The discovery was made during an intelligence-led operation targeting the growing vandalism of public infrastructure in the state. Police authorities said the operation also led to the recovery of vandalised iron materials and the arrest of 10 suspects linked to attacks on the coastal highway.

The development was disclosed at a joint briefing involving the Lagos State Commissioner of Police, CP Tijani Fatai, and officials of the Federal Ministry of Works.

Representing the Minister of Works, David Umahi, the Federal Controller of Works in Lagos, Olufemi Dare, said vandals had stolen about 1,800 concrete manhole covers, one kilometre of Clear View security fencing and 75

The Lagos-Calabar Coastal Highway is a 700-kilometre federal road project designed to connect several coastal states and improve transportation, connectivity and economic activities along the corridor.

Speaking on the arrests, Fatai said 10 suspects were apprehended on August 17 following sustained intelligence operations over repeated acts of vandalism along the highway.

He said vandalised iron materials were recovered from the suspects, who had also made statements to investigators regarding their alleged involvement.

The police commissioner disclosed that the crackdown extended to the Third Mainland Bridge, where a 28-year-old suspect, Chidiebere Ochiri, was arrested for allegedly stealing government-installed CCTV cables, copper wires and iron fittings.

New Airbus Aircraft Boosts Ibom Air Expansion, Aviation Growth - Eno

Akwa Ibom State Governor, Umo Eno, has described the acquisition of a new Airbus A220-300 aircraft by Ibom Air as a major milestone in his administration's efforts to expand the state-owned airline and strengthen the state's aviation industry.

Eno, who spoke with journalists shortly after arriving at Ibom International Airport, Uyo, said the latest acquisition demonstrated the administration's commitment to sustained investment in the aviation sector.

According to him, the new aircraft is the third Airbus acquired since he assumed office in 2023, while two additional aircraft have been fully paid for, bringing the total number of

aircraft acquired or fully paid for under his administration to five.

“The new aircraft speaks volumes, not just for Ibom Air, but for Akwa Ibom State as we seek to expand the airline. It shows consistency,” the governor said.

He also disclosed that work on the state's Aviation Village, particularly the Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) facility, was nearing completion.

Eno said the completion and full operation of the aviation ecosystem would create employment opportunities, generate foreign exchange and contribute to the state's Gross Domestic Product.

“When all of this ecosystem begins to function the way it should, you will see the jobs it is going to create, the foreign exchange earnings it is going to bring and, of course, the effect on our GDP as a state,” he said.

The governor expressed optimism that the investments would ultimately improve the standard of living of

residents and deliver tangible benefits to the people.

The latest aircraft acquisition follows Eno's recent visit to Montreal, Canada, where he led a state delegation for the pre-delivery inspection of Ibom Air's third Airbus A220-300.

The brand-new aircraft is expected to arrive at Victor Attah International Airport, Uyo, by the end of August, increasing Ibom Air's fleet to 10 aircraft.

The aircraft is expected to provide additional capacity, support the airline's network expansion and improve air connectivity within Nigeria and beyond.

Meanwhile, Eno has urged Akwa Ibom residents to reject divisive rhetoric and embrace peace and unity, saying collective development remains critical to the state's progress.

Reacting to comments attributed to some youth groups from the Oro and Ibibio areas, the governor said his

administration had continued to promote the “Akwa Ibom United” mantra by ensuring equitable development across the state's 31 local government areas.

He maintained that his administration had worked with people from different parts of the state without discrimination, including in the composition of his cabinet and key government appointments.

Eno warned against attempts to create divisions among the people, stressing that Akwa Ibom, as a minority state, could only achieve meaningful development through unity and peaceful coexistence.

He urged residents to ignore divisive narratives, lower the rhetoric and remain focused on the development of the state.

The governor said the administration's commitment to peace would also be reflected in the state's annual Christmas Carol, which will be held under the theme, “Peace on Earth, Goodwill to Men.”

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
